DUFFY'S CUT

In 1828 the Philadelphia and Columbia Line was started. It was originally a horse drawn line expected to compete with canal traffic. A double track line and built with public funding, it was open to all shippers that would supply their own horses, cars and drivers. In 1857 it became part of the Pennsylvania Railroad.

By 1831 a contractor by the name of Philip Duffy was engaged to construct a particularly difficult section of the line. It required the removal of a hill and the subsequent fill placed in a nearby valley. This process is known as "a cut'. Duffy, a veteran of many previous rail projects was known to use strong young men from the north of Ireland to muscle though his projects. With wages of ten dollars for a month of work, and an allotment of whisky, life was difficult for the workers.

With living conditions as poor as they were, cholera soon swept through Philadelphia. The 57 workers tried to abandon their grim housing but were turned away by others in the area. They returned to their housing and were tended by the Sisters of Charity and a local blacksmith. When they died they were buried in the cut by the blacksmith and their housing was burned.

Nothing was ever heard of them again until twin brothers, Bill and Frank Watson uncovered documents they inherited from their grandfathers old files from the Pennsylvania Railroad. Stories had been told of a man walking home from a tavern reporting to see "blue and green ghosts dancing in the mist on a warm September night in 1909". Documents indicated that men "were buried where they were making the fill, which is the original railroad bridge.'

In 2002 the brothers began digging in the area and in 2008 with help from geoscientist Tim Bechtel began using ground penetrating radar. A few months later human remains were found. With the identification of an unusual genetic trait, they may have also uncovered the identity of one of the remains. Should this be the case the remains would be sent back to Donegal, Ireland to be interred in a family plot. Unclaimed remains are to be buried beneath a Celtic cross in West Laurel Hill cemetery.

The location of the original unmarked mass grave has been memorialized with a large state historical marker.
