DEAD HORSE TRAIL

In the Late 1800's there were two main ways from the Alaskan coast to the Yukon, The Chilkoot Pass from Dyea and The White Pass from Skagway. The Chilkoot was known as "The meanest 32 miles in the world". It may have been just so. One portion of the trail called "The Golden Stair" consisted of 1,500 steps cut into the side of the mountain. The Mounted Police required each prospector to bring one ton of supplies into the Yukon. Thus, they were forced to carry 50 to 60 pound packs, on their backs, up the mountain roughly forty times. This, for only one stretch of the trail.

The White Pass out of Skagway was touted as the easier of the two passes. Many were lead to believe the trail would accommodate wagons, and indeed it did, in the beginning. When the trail met the mountains the path narrowed to two feet and turned to cutbacks with sharp rises to one side and steep drop-offs to the other. With no room to maneuver, progress became virtually impossible. Wagonless, men still forced their pack animals up the trail.

Many of the prospectors had no knowledge of animal handling. Without the wagons the animals were cruelly overloaded. It is a strange thing what gold fever does to a person. Animals were treated harshly. Some would fall and perish in the river under their heavy loads. Others broke down unable to handle the strain and were shot where they fell. It is estimated that of the 3,000 horses that started up the trail, less than a dozen survived. For a fictional insight based on this situation, the famous writer, Jack London recounts his experiences of the Dead Horse Trail in "The Call of the Wild"
